Arriva is at it again!



On Sunday, 6 May, Arriva changed the X18 timetable reducing the number of buses coming into the centre of Alnmouth from every hour to every two hours with none in the evenings or on Sundays. They did not place new printed time-tables at the bus stops until several day afterwards. This meant that people were waiting at the stop by the Schooner Hotel for a bus that was never going to come. According to the Northumberland Gazette, Arriva's punctuality data shows that buses are often delayed in Alnmouth due to traffic congestion. In the evenings? Surely not, and wasn't the new one way system going to solve all that? Now drivers have to execute a tricky manoeuvre around the War Memorial. First there were fewer buses to the railway station, now there are fewer in the centre of the village – what next? *Ed.*
